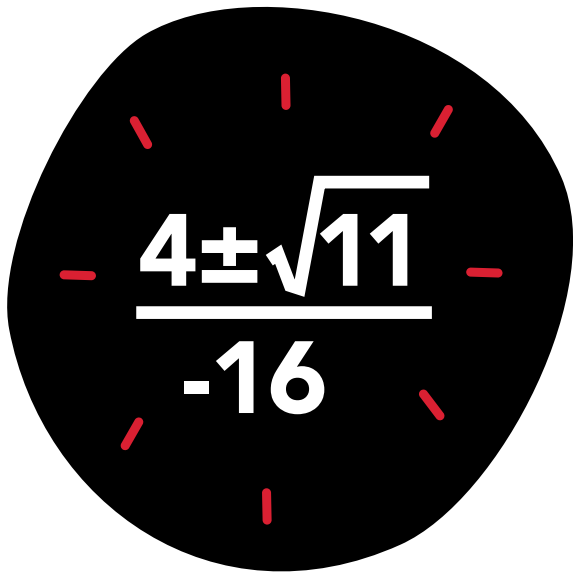


Contract Cheating

What is Contract Cheating?

Contract cheating is when a student submits work that was done by someone else: a friend, family member, tutor, or someone on a website.

All assignments must be an honest reflection of each student's knowledge and abilities.

Contract cheating does not align with ECU's values of working with Integrity, Respect, Rational Inquiry and Personal Excellence.
